While the “*Sea Knights*” unit is fictional, it is strongly based on the Coast Guard’s various “special forces” units that deal with everything from drug smuggling to terrorism and their use of multiple special tactics ranging from daring boarding actions to the deployment of airborne snipers.

The series is **action-centered** but it is also very much a character-driven drama where the portrayal of **very real (and complicated) lives** is integral to its story.

SEA KNIGHTS’ main characters are:

CAPT Louis “Lou” Marche — Group Commander

Once the “golden boy” of the Coast Guard, Marche’s abilities have begun to be questioned by some outside the unit because of his involvement in “that incident in Iraq” — often leading to tension and resistance at critical junctures. At home, Marche must deal with his carefree live-in college professor fiancé and her “troubled” 13 year-old son. Marche’s once-estranged daughter attends a nearby college.

LCDR Jean-Paul “JP” Bohomme — Executive Officer / Operations Ashore Leader

As a young boy, Bohomme was saved by the Coast Guard when he and his mother fled the turmoil of Haiti on a ramshackle boat which sank within sight of Florida. (His mother perished.) Bohomme is devoted to the Coast Guard but is haunted by his mother’s drowning. A devout Catholic, he has the most stable home life with a loving gregarious Creole-cooking wife and seven boisterous children. But he also has to cope with the problems of his aging sick adoptive mother and her increasing fascination with Voodoo.

LT Ellie Sharps — Air Assets Leader / Helicopter Pilot

A new member of the team, Sharps (an African American) is a skillful and daring pilot who received the assignment after another pilot was forced to resign because of reckless conduct. That pilot becomes increasingly mentally unstable and begins to stalk her. While quite amiable, Sharps is the most reserved of the group and rarely socializes with them. She lives with her flamboyant glass-blowing artisan cousin.

LT Matt “Zoo” Zuzuki — Surface Assets Leader / Enforcement Operations Liaison

A Hawaiian of Japanese ancestry, Zuzuki is a bit of a military nonconformist with laid-back ways — not what you’d expect from the typical gung-ho special ops leader. Suffering from PTSD, he can also display a “dark side.” He is devoted to his wife and young children but can, at times, exhibit potentially addictive tendencies as well as an active wandering eye. His “camaraderie” with an attractive DEA agent troubles some in the unit.

ENS Aaron “Boomer” Tinkle — Boarding & Clandestine Operations Leader

Another new member of the team, Tinkle is a freshly minted “up-through-the-ranks” officer and was one of the Coast Guard’s elite rescue swimmers before joining the Sea Knights. Tinkle’s chiseled physique makes him irresistible to countless women — whom he always has difficulty maintaining relationships with.

CWO Josie “J-Mac” McMurray — Intelligence Analyst

McMurray, a Mexican American, is intellectually gifted and a little nerdy. She is totally focused on her job and dreadfully unfocused in her home life. A product of a tough Los Angeles barrio, McMurray gave birth to a daughter when she was 14 but has had little contact with her — until she arrives at her front door — 18 years old and pregnant.
